## Row Six - Parallelograms


## **Row Six Rules**

- 1. Finish blocks should measure 6" square. Make Six (6) blocks for this row.
- 2. Minimum of four (4) parallelograms per block.
- 3. The blocks do not have to be identical.
- 4. You can use squares and/or rectangles in your blocks.


#### **Quilting 101: Making Parallelograms**

Think of a parallogram as a flying goose with a broken wing. You start with a rectangle and two squares.











square wrong side of squares corner together. Sew on line.


Draw diagonal line on Place square on corner Trim and press square of rectangle, right sides sides together. Sew on line.


Place square on opposite toward corner corner of rectangle, right





#### Row Seven - Three Triangle Square

**Row Seven Rules:** 

- 1. Finished block should measure 6" square. Make six (6) blocks for this row.
- 2. Minimum of four three triangle square unit per block.
- 3. The blocks do not have to be identical.
- 4. You can use any other elements in your blocks.

#### Quilting 101: Making three triangle squares

Finished Size Cut Size Small square Cut Size Large square 2"

3-1/4" (cut one small square from two fabrics)
3" (cut two large squares from one fabric)



Clockwise Spin

Place small triangle fabrics right side together. Draw both diagonal lines on background fabric. Draw sewing lines 1/4" to the **Right** of diagonal lines as indicated. Stitch on sewing lines. Cut on drawn diagonal lines. Press seam toward darker fabric.



Place small triangle fabrics right side together. Draw both diagonal lines on background fabric. Draw sewing lines 1/4" to the Left of diagonal lines as indicated. Stitch on sewing lines. Cut on drawn diagonal lines. Press seam toward darker fabric.

Counterclockwise Spin

You will have 4 triangles which look

Cut large square on the diagonal

like figure to the left.

to make large triangles.



You will have 4 triangles which look like figure to the left.



Cut large square on the diagonal to make large triangles.




Fold large triangle in half to find center. Match center of large triangle to seam of pieced triangles. (Note the large triangle will be larger than the pieced unit.). Sew 1/4" seam along long edge.



Press open. Square up unit by placing diagonal line of ruler on seam. Trim excess. Turn unit and trim the other side.








Press open. Square up unit by placing diagonal line of ruler on seam. Trim excess. Turn unit and trim the other side.

Corner or Center Square - 2-1/2" Half-square Triangle 2-7/8" Four Patch - 1-1/2" Hour Glass - 3-1/4"



The meeting was called to order by Sandy Waters at 5:30 pm.

Secretary's Report: The January minutes were accepted as read and filed.

**Treasurer's Report:** There was no treasurer's report because there was no banking activity for 2 months.

**Old Business:** Because the January workshop and meeting were cancelled, the Quilts to Share workshop has been moved to May.
