Make a quilt label on your printer

I found a quick and easy way to make a quilt label on a printer. Hopefully I have explained it well enough for you to follow the instructions listed below.

You will need an inkjet printer, regular printer paper, freezer paper, glue stick, and label fabric.

1. First determine how your paper feeds into the printer so

The next KQ Newsletter deadline is: April 8, 2022. Submissions received after this date will be considered for the next newsletter.

Please email your submission to April Schriever, editor, at april.schriever@VLScrusaders.org you know which side of the loaded paper gets printed. Glue the nonshiny side of the freezer paper to the printer paper using your glue stick. Be sure the edges are well glued to avoid getting caught in your printer.

- 2. Center the fabric on the shiny side of the freeze paper and iron the fabric to the freezer paper.
- 3. Prepare the wording for your label on your computer. I use Microsoft Word. You may want to practice on plain paper so you can determine the lettering size, wording, and spacing before you print it on the fabric label.
- 4. Load the prepared printer paper with your label into your printer and print the label.
- 5. Iron the ink side of the fabric to set the print. Remove the label from the printer paper and do any necessary manipulation of the label. I make the label big enough so I can do all the folding and sewing and more after it is printed.
- 6. Sew it on your project.

2022 QUILT SHOW UPDATE MAINLY OUILTS

The 2022 Keepsake Quilters Quilt Show is November 5th and 6th, 2022, at the Cedar Falls Community Center. Set up will be Friday, November 4, from 3:30 until finished.

The challenge quilt for this show will be Mainly One Color meaning 75 percent of the quilt must be one color. You are able to use shades of the color. The size is not really specified; however, please have it larger than a miniature quilt.

Please start planning the quilts you will enter in the show. The Quilt Categories are:

- Bed Quilt 280" or greater (one needle and professionally quilted)
- Small Quilt less than 280" (one needle and professionally quilted)
- Miniature Quilt blocks less than 4" •
- Applique (hand or machine; cotton or wool)
- Paper Pieced
- Art Quilt
- Novice Quilt less than 2 years and never entered a quilt show
- Miscellaneous
- Hand Quilted
- Challenge

There will NOT be a planning meeting prior to the March meeting.


