#### PRESIDENT'S CHALLENGE By Peggee Frost

My President's Challenge for the Keepsake Quilters Guild for 2023-2024 is called "BLOCKS TO SHARE". I am urging you to make three different blocks throughout the year that are either 12.5 inches unfinished or 11 inches unfinished. The three block patterns that will be used are as follows: the Woven Ribbon Block, the Amish Block, and the Rainbow Flower Block. They can be made in any color including seasonal prints. Please work on these blocks during the year and turn them in to me at our monthly meetings.

Some of you do not have a lot of scraps and have asked if you could send yardage instead. So, an alternative to block construction would be to donate 3 yards for a backing.

We will then be constructing quilts with these blocks at the May 2024 workshop. When the tops are finished, they will be donated to Quilts To Share. The sample patterns of the blocks will be available at our meeting or can be found on our website at: keepsakequiltersguildcv.org/challenges.html.



#### November 20, 2023

<u>Workshop:</u> November's workshop is Janet Drake's Poise Table Runner. It is a raw edge applique project. The cost for members is \$10 and supplies include:

- 4 12" squares of background fabric
- 12 additional pieces of fabric for the poises cut in the following:
- 4 11" squares
- 4 10" squares
- 4 8" squares
- 4 4" squares for the flower center
- 1/2 yard fabric for the border

<u>Program:</u> Our November evening program will also feature Janet Drake called "Quilts and Color: Community Quilt Show of Unhappy Quilts". This program requires audience participation! Attendees are encouraged to bring a quilt they have made in the past but find themselves disappointed with the final result. The goal is to facilitate discussion and share great tips for a learning experience for all.

#### January 15, 2024

<u>Workshop:</u> In January, we are fortunate to have another member led a workshop called Trash Can Treasures Quilt. Chris Lorenz will lead the group to create fun blocks that can be combined to make multiple sized quilts. Be sure to pick up the supply list when signing up or visit the Keepsake Quilters website.

<u>Program:</u> January's evening program should be a lot of fun and enlightening! A group activity "Love It or Hate It" where members are asked to bring a quilting notion/tool they absolutely love and one that they wish they had never wasted their money on. Ideally, we will not only learn what we are missing out on, what to keep from buying but maybe even learn something about a notion we bought and didn't know how to properly use it! This is a group activity for all...beginner to expert... we can't wait to see what you love/hate!

#### February 19, 2024

<u>Workshop:</u> Our daytime workshop in February will be an OPEN SEW day featuring Quilts to Share. You can work on your own project or help the QTS team cut, prep, assemble, etc.

<u>Program:</u> Julie Letvin from Me and My Stitches joins us for our February evening program called "No! I don't want a sewing machine!" Julie will share her quilting journey through stories and her trunk show which includes her quilts and tiny paper-pieced quilt jewelry!

Old Business: We reviewed the enrollment forms for the Element 3 Medicare Advantage Reimbursement Program and after getting the final documents, we voted to not participate in the program as it will not benefit our membership or Guild. We discussed possible locations for the next Quilt Show. Peggee will look into a few more suggestions. We discussed that we will be passing the hat at the November meeting and the money collected will be donated to the church.

Programs: Our November workshop will be led by Jan Drake on "Raw Edge Applique". In the evening, Jan will give a presentation, "Color". There is no December meeting or workshop. In January, Chris Lorenz will lead a workshop on Trash Can Quilts and our evening program will be a Love it or Hate it by the Guild membership. Our February workshop will be an open sew but we will be layering quilts for Quilts to Share. Our evening speaker will be Julie Letvin from Me and My Stitches.

Membership: We currently have 68 members. In October, we had 45 members in attendance.
