UFO (UNFINISHED OBJECT) CHALLENGE FOR NEXT YEAR By President-Elect Holly Boerhave

I am certain most of us have UFOs and would like to get them done before moving onto another project.

Your challenge, if you choose to accept it, is to dig out your unfinished projects and make decisions about which projects you want to complete. Fill out the registration form and turn into me at the May or June meeting. List each unfinished item (no more than 10) and indicate what is left to be done. The item must be in PROGRESS before June 1st, 2024. Estimate the time, in weeks, that it will take to complete your project and set a deadline. A separate UFO Show and Tell will take place at our monthly meetings, starting in August. In addition, there will be some small rewards along the way. The challenge will end at our meeting in May of 2025. At that meeting, we will wrap up our challenge by recognizing all participants and the progress they made. Whoever finishes all or most of their listed projects, will receive a special gift. But we all know, finishing our UFOs will be the best gift we can give ourselves.

How to participate - Fill out a provided sheet

First: Decide on your Unfinished Projects you expect to complete by May 2016 (Items must be started before the first of June 2024)

Second: List what has to be done to complete each project *

Optional: Estimate the time it will take to finish the project in weeks. Set your own deadline for a target month

Submit to Laurel Northey at the May or June Guild meeting.

** The item must be in progress. IF the fabric for the project has not been cut by June 1st, it does not qualify as a UFO. DO NOT list more than 10 projects.

Keepsake Quilter's Quilt Show Categories

Plan out what you'll enter into the show happening Oct 18th-19th!

Name	Number	Description	Label Color at Show
Bed Quilt/ One Needle	100	Pieced quilted and bound by one person. Perimeter is 280" or greater	Light Yellow
Bed Quilt/ Quilted by Another	200	Pieced and bound by one person, quilted by another person. Perimeter is 280" or greater	Teal
Small Quilt/ One Needle	300	Pieced, bound, and quilted by one person. Perimeter is less than 280"	Orange
Small Quilt/ Quilted by Another	400	Pieced and bound by one person, quilted by another person. Perimeter is less than 280"	Light Blue
Miniature Quilt	500	Overall pattern reflects the proportionately reduced scale, with individual blocks no larger than 4" square. All work is done by one person. May be hand or machine quilted.	Bright Yellow
Applique	600	Uses applique as the predominant construction technique. Hand or machine quilted by one person or other. No size limit.	Magenta
Wool	700	Predominantly wool quilt. No size limit. Hand or machine quilted.	Lime Green
Paper Pieced	800	Predom <mark>inant</mark> technique is paper piecing. Hand or machine quilted. No size limit.	Deep Blue
Challenge Quilt	900	Secondary pattern is apparent in piece. No size limit.	Pink
Art Quilt	1000	Uses non-traditional techniques that deviate from the traditional more historic approach. Emphasis is on design not functionality.	Bright Green
Hand Quilted	1100	Quilting by hand. May be heirloom, standard or big stitch quilting. No size limit.	Aqua
Miscellaneous	1200	Quilted item other than a quilt such as purse, pouch, pillow, bag, clothes, runners, rug, tree skirt, etc.	Golden

Newsletter: The deadline for the April newsletter is Friday, April 5, 2024.


Public Relations: Laura Richter reported that advertising contracts have been sent to all current advertisers.
