### "Tips, Tricks, and Techniques from the President."

If you have trouble threading your sewing machine needle or any needle for that matter try this: for the sewing machine, place a small piece of white paper behind the needle with one hand and thread with the other. For sewing needles, use any white or very light colored background.

It is important to sit directly in front of your line of sewing when sewing by machine. It will help make your seams straight as an arrow. If you sit even a little to one side or the other, your line of stitching will be just a bit off.



Workshop: "Scandinavian Snowflake" by Jodie Madison.

#### Scandinavian Snowflake Supply List

Pre-cutting the fabrics is a mandatory requirement prior to taking this class.

Please begin preparing for class several weeks in advance to make sure that you are familiar with your pattern and can complete the pre-cutting before arriving.

<u>Fabric Selection:</u> Please refer to the yardage on the back of your pattern for the required fabric amounts.

<u>Preparing your Foundation Papers:</u> Please read and follow the instructions under the section titled "General Information" at the bottom of page one.



Note: PLEASE PAY SPECIAL ATTENTION THAT YOU DO NOT CONFUSE FOUNDATION PAPERS WITH TEMPLATE LAYOUT SHEETS.

- Foundation Papers: These are the foundations that you will sew the fabric directly onto. These need to be trimmed leaving a 1/8' border. Do Not cut the individual units apart.
- Template Layout Sheets: The template layout sheets are used to cut your fabric. You will cut through these
  templates when you cut certain parts of your fabric. These need to be trimmed leaving a 1/16" border and used
  per the directions in the pattern.

<u>Cutting Instructions</u>: Follow the cutting instructions of page 4 through page 9 of your pattern. Place fabric into the bags specified in the cutting instructions.

The following items will be used in class:

- · Sewing Machine with a Quarter-inch foot
- Medium Size Cutting Mat
- Rotary Cutter
- Size 70 Needles
- Scissors
- 12" Add-a-Quarter Ruler
- Fabric Glue Pen (Fons & Porter Sewline Glue Stick will work well)
- Washable Glue Stick (UHU is the brand I use, but any washable glue will work like Elmer's)
- Purple Thang (Optional)
- Rule
- High Quality Cotton Sewing Thread
- Patteri
- Flower Pins (Judy recommends the flower pins but you can use any type of pin that you like)
- Binder Clips (These are the office supply binder clips that you can purchase at Wal-Mart, also you can use any type of device that would keep stacks of fabric held together.)
- Ziploc Bags
