SCRAPS FROM THE PRESIDENT

Happy July. Can you believe that summer is about half over? Where did it go? Have you been getting your quilts done for the quilt show? It is only 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ months away. Not long!

Did you enjoy Janet's talk on scraps? I know I did. I have been standing and looking at my stash to see what I will take to the workshop. Don't have any idea what I will be cutting for, but will make an attempt to get the scraps in some kind of order.

This month is the first row in my seven row president challenge. Cathy Busch has graciously agreed to allow us to use her Personal Mystery Row Robin. You can make all seven rows yourself or gather friends and make a round robin quilt. You make the first row, send it to another to make the second row, who then sends it to another to make the third row, and etc. If you want specific fabric used in each row, send it with your first row to the next person. At the end of the seven rows, the rows will come back to you to be put together with sashing and/or borders. If you don't want to make a quilt but want to make the rows, the rows can be given to Quilts to Share.

The rows will be half-square triangles, hour glass blocks, flying goose blocks, foundation piecing, triangles in a square, parallelograms, and three triangle squares.

Personal Mystery Row Robin

General Information:

- 1. You will be making seven (7) rows. The rows will measure 36¹¹ wide.
- 2. The seven (7) rows will measure 45" long.
- 3. Nine (9) inches of length will be free to use as you please sashing between the rows, for an applique row, or both.
- 4. The quilt center will measure 36" x 54". Rows do not need to be arranged in the order they are
- 5. Borders may be single fabric, pieced, or applique and should be no less than 3 11 and no more than 4-1/21 wide.
- 6. Quilts are to be completed by____
- 7. Creativity is encouraged. (e.g. embellishments, dimensional piecing or applique)

Row One - Half-square triangles

Row One Rules

- 1. Finished blocks should measure 6¹¹ square. Make six (6) blocks for this row.
- 2. Minimum of four (4) half-square triangles per block.
- 3. The blocks do not have to be identical.
- 4. You can only use half-triangle squares, squares, and/or rectangles in your blocks.


Quilting 101: Making half-square triangles

Two Square Method - cut squares 7/8 11 larger than finished size of half-square triangle unit


(for 2" unit cut squares at 2-7/81). Draw diagonal line on wrong side of lighter fabric. Place squares right sides together. Sew 1/4" on both sides of diagonal line. Cut on diagonal line. Press toward darker fabric. Unit should measure 1/211 larger than finished size. ** You can cut squares one (1) inch larger than finished size. Follow sewing instructions and square block to 1/2 11 larger than finished size. When squaring block, be sure to lay the diagonal line of ruler on the sewn diagonal line.

Thangles or other triangle on-a-roll method. Follow manufacturer's instructions.

Block Ideas (You may use any of these blocks or any other blocks that satisfy the rules)















Cutting Instructions:

half-square triangle - 2-7/81 squares

- (A) Small Square 2-1/2"
- (B) Rectangle 2' x 2-1/2"
- (C) Large Square 4-1/2'
- (D) Large half-square triangle 4-7/8" squares

2016 Quilt Show Co-Chairs Jeni Moravec and Liz Wehrmacher

(Set up on Thursday Nov. 3rd and Quilt Show on Friday 4th/Saturday 5th)

Here are the categories to inspire you!

2016 QUILT SHOW CATEGORIES

BED QUILT: Perimeter must be 280" or greater. The perimeter equals the sum of all the sides. **100** One Needle – Pieced, quilted & bound by ONE person **200** Professionally Quilted

SMALL QUILT: Perimeter must be smaller than 280" **300** One Needle – Pieced, quilted & bound by ONE person **400** Professionally Quilted

MINIATURE QUILT: Overall patterns reflect proportionately reduced scale, individual blocks no larger than 4" square. All work must be done by one person.

500 Hand or machine quilted

APPLIQUE: Uses applique as the predominant construction technique. **600** Hand or machine quilted. No size limit.

WOOL: 700 Predominantly wool. Hand or machine quilted. No size limit.

PAPER PIECED: 800 Predominantly paper pieced. Hand or machine quilted. No size limit.

2016 QUILT SHOW CHALLENGE: COLOR MY WORLD WITH QUILTS.

900 Must use at least 8 different colors. 180" perimeter minimum.

ART QUILT: 1000 No size limit, uses non-traditional techniques, may be done by hand or machine.

NOVICE: 1100 No size limit. Quilter has less than 2 years' experience and has never entered a quilt show.

MISCELLANEOUS: 1200 Quilted item other than a quilt (ie. Purse, tree skirt, clothing, runners, etc.)

HAND QUILTED: 1300 Hand quilted, any size

OPEN CLASS: 1400 Non-juried. Open to all members. Not eligible for awards.
