

Have you been wondering what's new in the world of wool quilts? Jeni Moravec will present a program on working with wool. She has many projects to share with us, including some from her Wool Club. Members are also invited to bring any wool projects that you have made to share with us.

FEBRUARY 15, 2016 Workshop: Slipknot Lazy Angle Block

Our February class is another opportunity to work with the Lazy Angle ruler taught by Jeni Moravec. If you took the class last year and want to do another project with this technique, OR you missed last year's class and want to become familiar with it, this is the class for you! Jeni will be teaching the Slipknot block from the book Lazy and Loving It. You must



have both the book and ruler for this class, and there is some homework before class. Materials list is available at the Guild meeting or on the KQ website. Come and join Jeni and learn this technique for making this quilt.

Our Quilt Show Committee is gearing up for another fabulous quilt show.

Here are the categories to inspire you!

2016 QUILT SHOW CATEGORIES

- BED QUILT: Perimeter must be 280" or greater. The perimeter equals the sum of all the sides.
 100 One Needle Pieced, quilted & bound by ONE person
 200 Professionally Quilted
- SMALL QUILT: Perimeter must be smaller than 280"
 300 One Needle Pieced, quilted & bound by ONE person
 400 Professionally Quilted
- MINIATURE QUILT: Overall patterns reflect proportionately reduced scale, individual blocks no larger than 4" square. All work must be done by one person.
 500 Hand or machine quilted
- APPLIQUE: Uses applique as the predominant construction technique. 600 Hand or machine quilted. No size limit.
- WOOL: 700 Predominantly wool. Hand or machine quilted. No size limit.

PAPER PIECED: 800 Predominantly paper pieced. Hand or machine quilted. No size limit.

2016 QUILT SHOW CHALLENGE: COLOR MY WORLD WITH QUILTS. 900 Must use at least 8 different colors. 180" perimeter minimum.

ART QUILT: 1000 No size limit, uses non-traditional techniques, may be done by hand or machine.

NOVICE: 1100 No size limit. Quilter has less than 2 years' experience and has never entered a quilt show.

MISCELLANEOUS: 1200 Quilted item other than a quilt (ie. Purse, tree skirt, clothing, runners, etc.)

HAND QUILTED: 1300 Hand quilted, any size

OPEN CLASS: 1400 Non-juried. Open to all members. Not eligible for awards.

The meeting was called to order by Debbie Guetzlaff at 5:30 p.m.

Present: Debbie Guetzlaff, Sandy Waters, Laura Richter, Shirley Thode, Laurel Northey, Leann Abraham, and Donna Winter.

Secretary's Report: The minutes of the November meeting were read and accepted.

Treasurer's Report: Shirley presented the treasurer's report. It was discussed and filed for audit.

Old Business: Joyce Kienast and Laurel Northey purchased a projector, 2 speakers, and a carrying case for \$642. Laurel has been playing with the projector and is still working on getting the wireless connection to work.

New Business: Start thinking about nominating a member for the Golden Needle and Golden Thread awards. Also, it is time to volunteer to be a board member. We need you! January is *half price* for membership. Notice will be sent out that membership dues need to be paid by May in order to be included in the membership book.

Programs: The **January workshop** will be a jellyroll race. Jeni Moravec will speak on working with wool and present a wool trunk show for the **January evening program**.
