July 6, 2015 Crazy to Quilt, Cedar Falls, IA The meeting was called to order by Debbie Guetzlaff at 5:30 pm.

**Present:** Debbie Guetzlaff, Sandy Waters, Shirley Thode, Janet Drake, Laurel Northey, Diane Olson, Karen Acton, Laura Richter, Mary Mumm, Leann Abraham

**Secretary's Report:** The minutes of the May meeting were read and accepted.

**Treasurer's Report:** The treasurer's report for May was presented. Shirley Thode explained the new treasurer's report format and it was well understood by the board. The treasurer's report was filed for audit.

**Old Business:** None

**New Business:** The board believes it is time to buy our own projector because many of our presenters use a projector. We believe a projector will cost between \$250 and \$400 but are still looking at the possibility of buy a used projector. If you know of any projectors for sale please contact Laurel Northey.

Diane Olson suggested that the Membership Listing include Nancy Hayes as a past president. Diane also suggested that the newsletter include a reminder that the guild has a library of quilt book at Crazy to Quilt.

**Programs:** Laurel announced that the **July** workshop led by Sue Plagge will make a bag. There are currently 19 quilters signed up for the workshop. The evening meeting will be a show-and-tell of bags. Each guild member will bring a bag to show and Sue Plagge will MC.

It was previously announced that there would be no workshop in **August** but members requested a **Sit** and **Sew**. Therefore there will be a sit and sew from 9am until 3pm. Because the program committee needs time to set up for the Mystery Dinner, the sit and sew will finish promptly at 3pm. The Mystery Dinner will be a four course dinner with acts of a mystery play between each course. **The Mystery Dinner meeting will start at 5:30.** There is a \$5 for guests but the dinner is free for members. There will be no business meeting or show-and-tell at the Mystery Dinner meeting.

The **September** workshop will be a Quilts to Share workshop lead by Janet O'Neil. This is a change from the schedule. Jeni Moravec was originally scheduled but because of her son's wedding she has switched with Janet. The evening meeting will still be Heide Kaisand teaching us how to "Finish It".

**Membership:** Laura reported that we currently have 82 paid members. At the June meeting 3 new members joined the guild.

**Newsletter:** Leann asked that all newsletter items be submitted by July 9<sup>th</sup>.

**Public Relations:** Karen has updated the guild's try-fold and it includes the dates for our 2016 Quilt Show.

**Adjournment:** The meeting was adjourned at 6:00. The next board meeting will be August 3 at 5:30 at Crazy to Quilt.

#### RECIPE: DELICIOUS APPLE SQUARES - Made by Shirley Thode for the May 2015 Meeting

2 ½ c. Flour

1 tsp. salt GLAZE.

1 C. Crisco 1 C. powdered sugar

1 egg yolk and water to make 2/3 C. 2 Tbl. water

1 tsp. cinnamon 1 tsp. vanilla

5 C. apples, peeled and chopped

1 ½ C Corn Flakes cereal - crushed

3/4 C. sugar

Combine the first 3 ingredients and cut in Crisco. Add egg yolk and water mixture. Mix until moistened. Roll out half of the dough on a 9X13 sheet. Sprinkle crushed Corn Flakes on the bottom. Next, top apples over the Corn Flakes. Combine sugar and cinnamon and sprinkle over apples. Roll out the other half of dough and place on top. Seal edges. Beat egg white and spread over top. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 to 60 minutes. Glaze while hot. Cut while warm. CHEF'S NOTE: Double the recipe and make the apple squares in a jelly roll pan.

### The Nancy Hayes Library

Nancy Hayes was elected and installed as KQ president in 2007 but died before she was able to serve. The **Nancy Hayes Library** was established in her memory.
