"Tips, Tricks and Techniques from the President"

- Cutting flannel and batting can leave your cutting mat fuzzy. An adhesive lint roller, the kind used for clothes, works great to clean it. Run the roller back and forth over the mat until the fuzz is gone.
- If you are a person who washes your fabric before you use it, this is the tip for you. Each time you purchase new fabric, serge or zig-zag the cut ends so there is no raveling when it is washed. Then toss it in the washing machine with compatible items and a color catcher (just in case!). When you pull out that fabric for a project, you know it has been washed if the ends are surged or zigzagged.

This is the space where you can post items for sale, trips you have taken, special quilting shop finds, or any others things that you think that we as a quilting community would find interesting.




