## ASSEMBLY

1 Wash, starch and press fabrics. Cut the patches listed in the materials and cutting box and shown in the rotary cutting diagrams.

2 Referring to the block 2 piecing diagram, join 16 dark blue \#1 B's and 16 ivory B's to make block 2. Q


Block 2 was taken from issue \#2 of Quilters Newsletter (December 1969) where it was identified as The Colorado Quilt block, which came from a 1941 Kansas City Star pattern.

## ROTARY CUTTING

Measurements include $1 / 4$ " seam allowances. Align arrows with lengthwise or crosswise grain of fabric.
