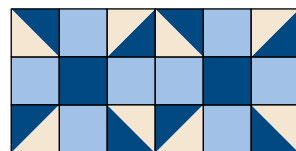
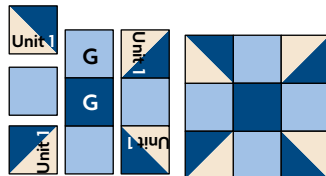

ASSEMBLY

- 1** Wash, starch and press fabrics. Cut the patches listed in the materials and cutting box and shown in the rotary cutting diagrams.
- 2** Referring to the unit 1 diagram, join an ivory F and a dark blue #1 F to make a unit 1. Make 16 unit 1's.
- 3** Referring to the block 4 piecing diagram, join 16 unit 1's, 4 dark blue #1 G's and 16 light blue G's to make block 4.

BLOCK 4 PIECING

MATERIALS AND CUTTING

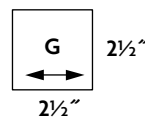
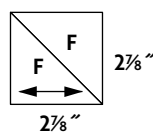
Cutting listed below is for block four only. For the complete yardage, see part one.

BLOCK SIZE: 12" **QUILT SIZE:** 60½" x 75"

MATERIALS	BLOCK 4 CUTTING
Dark Blue #1	16 F, 4 G
Light Blue	16 G
Ivory	16 F

ROTARY CUTTING

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Align arrows with lengthwise or crosswise grain of fabric.



Block 4 was taken from issue #6 of *Quilters Newsletter* (April 1970) where it was identified as *The Calico Puzzle* and labeled as a reprint from the *Kansas City Star* in 1930.

The Quilted in Honor fabric comes in many colors, shades and prints. Feel free to choose whichever you prefer.
